Internationally recognized as a leading cellist of our time, Tsang has appeared as soloist with such orchestras as the New York, Moscow and Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestras, the American and National Symphony Orchestras, and the Hollywood

Bowl Orchestra. In addition to the great standards, his concerto repertoire includes many lesser-known romantic works from the 19th and 20th centuries including the concerti of Korngold, Herbert, Dohnányí and Enecsu, of which he gave the U.S. premiere at Lincoln Center. As a great admirer of the old style of string playing, Tsang often programs on his recitals those encore pieces once championed by the likes of Casals, Heifetz, and Joachim. He plays many of these gems in the original violin version, demanding truly amazing technical feats on the cello.
